The purpose of the course is to provide a student with a profound knowledge in the field of protection of human rights at national and international level (in the framework of the United Nations, the Council of Europe and the European Union). In order to upgrade the theoretical knowledge students develop the ability to resolve concrete practical issues by analyzing relevant treaty provisions and case-law of the European Court of Human Rights and strengthen basic skills for preparing applications to the European Court of Human Rights.

After finished assignments students will be capable to understand principles and rules of international protection of human rights and will possess fundamental skills necessary for analysis of judgments of the ECrtHR.
