Overview

Tashkent State University of Law (TSUL) is the leading specialised higher education institution in the Republic of Uzbekistan responsible for training highly qualified legal professionals, conducting legal research, and contributing to the development of the national legal system.

Located in **Tashkent, Uzbekistan**, TSUL serves as the principal centre for legal education in the country and plays an important role in preparing lawyers, legal scholars, judges, prosecutors, advocates, government officials and specialists for both the public and private sectors.

The University combines traditional legal education with modern approaches based on international standards, comparative law, digital technologies and practical legal training. TSUL actively develops international cooperation with leading foreign universities, research institutions and professional organisations.

History and Establishment

Tashkent State University of Law traces its origins to the **Tashkent State Institute of Law**, which was established as Uzbekistan's specialised institution for legal education.

In **2013**, following reforms aimed at improving the quality of legal education and strengthening the role of legal professionals in society, the institution was transformed into **Tashkent State University of Law** by the Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

The establishment of TSUL marked an important stage in the modernisation of Uzbekistan's legal education system. The University was assigned the mission of creating a modern legal education model based on:

- international academic standards;
- practical legal training;
- innovative teaching methods;
- cooperation with foreign law schools;
- development of legal research.

Since its establishment, TSUL has become the flagship university for legal education and legal science in Uzbekistan.

Mission

The mission of Tashkent State University of Law is to educate highly qualified legal professionals who possess strong theoretical knowledge, practical skills, ethical values and the ability to address modern legal challenges.

The University aims to contribute to:

- strengthening the rule of law;
- improving legal culture and awareness;
- supporting judicial and legal reforms;
- developing internationally competitive legal specialists;
- promoting legal research and innovation.

International cooperation is one of the strategic priorities of Tashkent State University of Law.

Opportunities for International Students

TSUL welcomes foreign citizens and provides opportunities to study in Uzbekistan's leading legal institution.

For the **2026/2027 academic year**, a special admission procedure has been introduced for foreign citizens applying for Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes.

Under this procedure:

- foreign applicants may be admitted **without entrance examinations**;
- admission is conducted through an **interview process**;
