

## Poverty – Corruption - Development Essay competition

Integriteta – Association for Ethics in Public Service invites young people to share their views on the opportunities, challenges and implications on the topic of poverty, corruption and development.

Young people today are crucial to building our future, so it is necessary to enable them to develop their potential. This competition aims to encourage young people to think about the consequences of corruption, negative effects which it has to society, and to establish zero tolerance to unethical behavior and corruption.

Every summer since 2000 Faculty of Economics University of Ljubljana organises a three-week programme Ljubljana Summer School. This year **Ljubljana Summer School 2011 - Take the Best from East & West** will be carried out between 4 and 22 July 2011. Students who apply for **Corruption and Development course** at Ljubljana Summer School 2011 are eligible to enter the essay contest. The contest refers to the writing of an essay of up to 1,500 words. All terms and conditions of the competition are written in the document **Terms and conditions**.

The essay must be submitted **by the end of 22 April 2011**.
