Application	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Have your home university submit the exchange student nomination form to the Study Abroad Coordinator. 2) Apply to SHSU through www.applytexas.com. Be sure to choose "Non degree-seeking" and either "International Freshman" or "International Graduate" depending on your student status. DO NOT PAY THE APPLICATION FEE! 3) Submit Proof of English Proficiency (TOEFL/iBT or IELTS), Transcripts from your Home University, Proof of Financial Support, and Color Copy of your Passport.

Language Courses	Language courses are available in Arabic, French, German, and Spanish.	
Credits	Typically, a 3 semester credit hour course meets for 3 contact hours per week for the 15 weeks of a semester. In total, the 3 semester credit hour course meets for 45 contact hours. A student must take a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester to be considered a full-time student.

Visa Requirements	
All Countries	A student visa is required for all nationalities. Information on visa requirements is available at https://j1visa.state.gov/ . The visa process takes at least 8 weeks and requires a visit to an American Embassy or Consulate. A tourist visa does not authorize studying in the USA. The Office of International Program will provide you with more information once you have applied to the University.

Cost of Living	Students must allow for a minimum of \$800 per month to cover living expenses.
Work	Though your main purpose is to study at SHSU, if you are looking for a part-time job, exchange students can work on campus up to 20 hours per week.
Health Insurance	
Health Insurance	All exchange students must get the SHSU International Student Health Insurance. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$1,536 for students staying a year. • \$587 for students staying for the fall semester. • \$949 for students staying for the spring semester (covers spring & summer).
